

Homeless Children's Education Fund. Their teen outreach program began meeting with Aaron consistently on site in the Womanspace East game room. Eventually, Aaron started attending teen nights at the Carnegie Library. He continued into the HCEF summer placement program with the Carnegie Library DEI department and is currently in their College Club learning about paths to the career of his choice.
